

One Day Safety Awareness Training

TXTEAMM will provide a 3 hour, hands-on, ride the ATV Ridercourse (RC), utilizing a “S” (for shortened) format.

We will bring ATVs, all safety gear, course and range materials needed for this training. This portion generally begins in the morning (8-9am) and should be done at noon or shortly after. This training will NOT certify you to provide the RC.

Safety Awareness Training (SAT) class registration cost is \$25 per person.

Anyone from the public will need to pay \$155 OR if they purchased a new ATV this training may be free AND include a cash or merchandise “incentive”. The VIN number for the ATV will be needed to determine this, preferably beforehand. We prefer that the purchased ATV is used for the RC, but not absolutely necessary. (This does not include any machine with a steering wheel!)

TXTEAMM will provide a 3 hour, in classroom ATV/OHV Safety Awareness Training (SAT) in the afternoon. We will provide all course materials needed for the SAT and it will begin at 1-1:30 pm, finishing at approx. 4pm. Participants who successfully complete both portions of this training (RC and SAT) will be certified through TXTEAMM as ATV/OHV Safety Awareness Educators (SAE).

The SAT will be held in an indoor classroom setting. We'll need tables, chairs, and electricity (HVAC would be nice!). The SAT explains the “golden rules” of ATV/OHV Safety, provides all educational materials and/or a hard copy/thumb drive manual. It gives you the 5 W's (who, what, when, where and why) of educating youth (and adults) about how to be more safe when using ATVs/OHVs. All SAE's are required to sign a Memorandum of Understanding, perform a minimum of two SA presentations per year, schedule and report all presentations through TXTEAMM. All materials needed to present and lecture can be provided by TXTEAMM along with occasional per diem expense reimbursement. We require a minimum of 6 and if we have enough ATVS we can train up to 16.
